She also appeared on various TV stations in San Diego and made home videos of herself singing covers of songs originally performed by her favorite music artists that included Beyonce, Etta James and Whitney Houston. But what really paved the road to her stardom was her audition for American Idol in 2011.

Becoming a World Idol The exceptional talent that Jessica projected throughout the season left judges Randy Jackson, Jennifer Lopez and Steven Tyler awestruck. Nothing seemed to faze her at all. But Jessica is quick to

Aside from being nearly eliminated from the competition (the judges used their power to save an eliminated contestant on her), another news brought an emotional blow to Jessica the week after—the deployment of her father to Singapore.

Being a daddy's girl, Jessica was deeply affected but she remained strong. Her father also vowed to be present in her remaining performances until the finals to show his support. Jessica used the news of her father's deployment to give her strength and inspiration, which helped her deliver a powerful performance with her rendition of "Dance with My Father," which earned her more respect from America. Jessica says, "You shouldn't let anybody or anything get in your way. You just have to believe in yourself and go after your dreams."

The Homecoming

Jessica may have finished in the runner up spot, but in the eyes and hearts of the Filipinos, she was already a world idol.

And that proved to be true when she was given the chance to visit the Philippines during the American Idol Tour.

Having never been out of the United States her whole life, Jessica hasn't had the chance to visit the Philippines. Because of this, being in the Philippines (along with her fellow top ten) brought her mixed feelings of nervousness and excitement.

"It's amazing," Jessica can't help but gush. "Being here is a new experience. I came here not knowing what to expect but it's amazing! It's a whole new chapter of my life and I'm learning a lot. All the fans here are very, very supportive. They have my back here and I love it!"
