From being a star athlete in school, Ronnie Alonte is now changing gears and turning into a different kind of star—this time under the showbiz spotlight

efore getting into the whirlwind that is show business, Ronnie Alonte's teenage life consisted of getting up in the morning, and spending most of the day playing basketball.

Back then, the 18-year-old Biñan, Laguna native probably never imagined that he would become a celebrity, appear in commercials and TV shows, and have a large and active fan base.

Born on October 26, 1996, Ronnie hails from a well-to-do family. However, when he was a young boy, their extravagant lifestyle suddenly came to a halt when his father lost an eye from a motorcycle accident, rendering him unfit to work. Because of this unfortunate event, their family began to experience financial challenges.

This phase of Ronnie's life was portrayed in detail in an episode of Maalaala Mo Kaya (MMK). It showed how he had to move to a public school to save on tuition fees. There, he fell in step with a rebellious crowd, directing his teenage angst at his parents, at one time blaming them for the misfortunes they suffered. Ronnie kept them in the dark as to what was really going on at school until he reached the point where he flunked out and could hide things no longer.

That was a wake-up call for him.
Fortunately, it was Ronnie himself who realized what was happening, just in time.
He dug deep into himself, re-discovered his love for basketball, and used that to reform his rebellious ways.

One day, after watching one of his barangay basketball games, the head coach of Perpetual Help University's high school basketball team recruited him and offered him a varsity scholarship. Ronnie accepted the offer, which gave him the motivation to do better in school.

Finally in 2015, ABS-CBN held auditions for an all-male dance group called Hashtags and Ronnie decided to try his luck, performing a choreographed routine to the tune of Justin Bieber's "Where Are You Now?" Fortunately, he was accepted and became a member of the Hashtags, performing regularly on It's Showtime.

Since then, he has earned a fair share of supporters, as evidenced by the growing number of his followers on his social media accounts.

To Ronnie, this overwhelming support is unexpected. "Hindi ako addict sa social media. Bihira ako mag-update kaya hindi

ko alam kung bakit and'yan pa rin sila," he says of his fans. "Nagugulat na lang din ako. Pero mahal ko sila."

or someone who shuns attention, it seems so ironic that Sue Ramirez is in showbiz, a world where every eye is literally set on you. But at the end of the day, her passion for the performing arts will always burn ever so brightly that it extinguishes any inhibitions she might have.

Raised in Parañaque City, Sue was born to a Jewish-American father and a Filipina mother on July 20, 1996. The youngest of five siblings, Sue grew up loving sports. "Lahat ng sports—sabihin mo, kaya ko 'yan, from basketball, to swimming, to badminton," she says, proudly.

Meant to be

When Sue was six, her father had a stroke that paralyzed the right side of his body, limiting his mobility.

"I grew up na may sakit 'yung dad ko," Sue remembers. "A few years after his first stroke, na-stroke ulit siya. Then he would have seizures hanggang sa naging bedridden na siya."

Despite the medical bills piling up, their family still managed to get by with the help of her father's pension and her mother's stable job. But Sue still wanted to contribute financially, so when she saw a call for auditions at ABS-CBN, she didn't hesitate.

"I was 12 or 13 years old then," she shares. "Pang-697 ako sa pila noon. Buong araw akong nakapila. Nu'ng turn ko na, they asked me to showcase my talent so I sang. Then VTR na after that."

From a thousand hopefuls, the list was narrowed down to just 15. The rest of the time, she was kept in suspense.

It was a Wednesday, and like most of the Catholic faithful, she went to hear mass at the Baclaran Church.

She remembers praying fervently for positive news to come from her audition. Finally—by some miracle—when she and her mother stepped out of the church, she received a text from Star Magic, telling her to attend a go-see for a teen-oriented reality show.

"That was my first show na tumagal ng around three months," gushes Sue about her first foray into showbiz, Shoutout! "After that, I auditioned for soaps and other shows. I was able to get into (the horror-drama show) Oka2kat and in the remake of Mula sa Puso," Sue adds, thrilled about her baby steps into the world of entertainment.

For the Love

A couple of years after her showbiz debut in 2011, her father passed away. It was a sad event for the whole family, but more so for Sue who is still eaten up by guilt for being distant from her father while he was still alive.

But apart from the guilt, Sue also started questioning her drive and motivation for remaining in showbiz.

"So when he passed away, hindi ko na alam kung bakit ko pa siya ginagawa. But inevitably, it came to me that I really love acting talaga, and the passion keeps me going."

To the future

When asked if she has plans to go back to school, Sue reveals that she hopes to do so soon. Had she not been in showbiz, she would have been in her third year of college, taking up either Dentistry or Psychology.

Right now, Sue has been enjoying a steady stream of projects, including hosting the ASAP Chillout segment, and portraying the role of Angela Urtola, elder sister of Serena Marchesa (played by Liza Soberano) in Dolce Amore.

The young actress believes things can only get better.

"Every opportunity that I've had since I started is a highlight," she says. "I'm happy it happened slowly so I got to enjoy the freedom and privacy. And now, I'm happy sa kinalalagyan ng career ko."
